## YOU HAVE TO SEE THIS!

- Like alternative places?** Relax in one of Off's bars or cafes. Enter from the side of Roosevelta Street.  
**Want to tour Lodz on a bike?** Go on a rickshaw tour along Piotrkowska Street or rent a bike in one of the city's bike rentals.
- Want to take a look at Lodz from above?** Visit the Manufaktura view terrace.
- Want to travel back in time and feel the 90s atmosphere?** Go for a coffee and cake to Hortek (106 Piotrkowska Street) or visit Bar Anna (11 Tuwima Street).
- When traveling with children, visit the Se-Ma-For Museum of Animation** (1/3 Targowa Street). A lot of excitement is awaiting children at the Museum of Cinematography (1 Zwycięstwa Square). Don't miss the giant shoe featured in Kingsajz, which is now the centerpiece of the museum yard.  
**Take your family to the FALA Aquapark** (4 Unii Lubelskiej Alley).
- Strolling down the streets of Lodz, notice the dwarves** – the cast iron gate fenders from the 19th century.
- Everyday at noon, listen to **Przaśniczka** (the city's official anthem). Look for the trumpeter in the Heintzel palace in 104 Piotrkowska Street. Currently The City of Lodz Office.
- See a historical steam-engine pump**, originally horse-drawn to put out fires in the city. The carriage is currently "resting" in front of the Main Fire Service Headquarters in Lodz in 111/118 Wolczańska Street.
- Visit the geometric city center** located next to the building in 8 Przędzalniana Street.
- Visit one of the largest Jewish cemeteries in Europe** (entrance from Zmienna Street) and the Radegast railway station (12 Pamieci Oskar Litmanstadt Getto Alley) – currently a museum.
- Take a stroll around the Księży Młyn district**, visit the Lodz Open-Air Museum of Lodz's Wooden Architecture or listen to live music in the summer on the yard of Geyer's White Factory.
- Find Lodz bridge of lovers!** Take a romantic walk in the Poniatowski Park and marvel at the Love Fountain in Liberty Square. According to the legends, when a couple wash their faces with the water from the fountain, their love will be forever.
- Rest from the hustle and bustle of the city!**  
**Go for a walk** to the Stefankiego Ponds (3 Patriotyczna Street) or the Jana Ponds (247 Rzgowska Street).  
**Climb up** Rudzka Góra 230 m above sea level (Starorudzka Street).  
**Pop in** the line park in Arturówek (20/24 Studzianka Street).  
**Take a recess** in the city's largest recreational forest – the tagiewnicki Forest of 1 205.45 ha of total area.  
**Play chess** in the Downtown Park, also referred to as the "Herring Park".  
**Visit one** of the city's 30 public parks. In the summer, take your friends to Polowka (Summer Film Festival: [www.palowka.pl](http://www.palowka.pl))  
**Exercise** in the Nowa Gdynia Station (1 Sasnowa Street, Zgierz)  
**Relax** in the Wodny Raj indoor pool (2 Wierniej Rzeki Street).  
In the winter, visit the "Bombonierka" ice skating rink (28 Stefanowskiego Street) or the ice skating rink in Retkinia.
- Practice** mountain climbing in Stratosfera (58 Drewnowska Street)
- Visit** the ZOO, the Botanical Garden or the Palm House.

## HOW TO TRAVEL IN THE CITY?

**By car.** The first parking hour in Lodz is c.a. PLN 2.

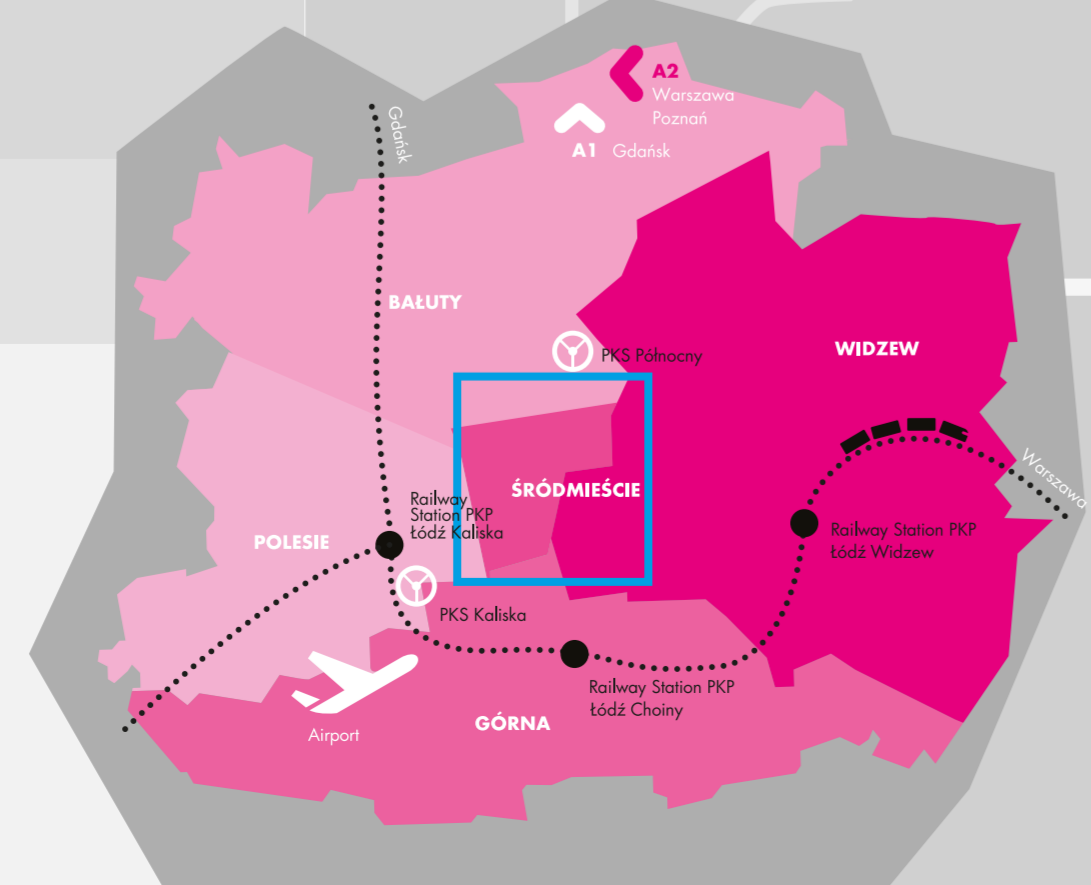
With public transportation – **tram or bus**.  
Check the schedule at: [www.mpk.lodz.pl](http://www.mpk.lodz.pl)  
Make sure to have one of the 20-, 40-minute or 24-hour tickets!

With a **rickshaw** around the city center. Rickshaw services are available all year round along the Piotrkowska pedestrian precinct, from 8.00 a.m. to late-night hours. A single travel is c.a. PLN 5/person.

**By bike.** Lodz will soon enjoy its first city bike service. For now, resort to several bike rental companies.

Visit one of Lodz's **200 palaces and factory villas**, revitalized the 19th-century textile centers: **Manufaktura** and lots in Tymienieckiego Street as well as Poland's only multi-department **Central Museum of Textile Industry** located in 282 Piotrkowska Street.

Remember! Go for a walk along the longest European pedestrian street – **Piotrkowska Street** to marvel at exquisite historical tenement houses and to stop for a dinner somewhere on the way. Make sure to peep inside the numerous Piotrkowska backyards! Visit **OFF Piotrkowska**.
